LAND Trust Funds

Last year, ATEC's School Community Council (SCC) used LAND Trust Funds to purchase tablets, cases, and applications to increase work skills and career exploration through video demonstrations of work based learning environments.

The tablets are used to create video models of appropriate behavior in work sites and to demonstrate what is expected in those work sites.

Other videos have been created on the tablets to help individual students increase their independence by watching a correct video demonstration and/or a video of them performing the skill. This has been very effective for our students.


