



Principal Message



Lehi High School is an incredible place. It is exciting to see student achievement at Lehi High. Graduation rates have increased significantly, AP pass rates continue to improve, and many student programs, such as FFA and SkillsUSA are examples of excellence in our state and nation. Along with the classes that we have at Lehi High, we continue to offer honor classes, Advanced Placement and Concurrent Enrollment courses for students to enhance their learning, while earning college credit.

With our focus on continues improvement for student achievement, teachers, advocates, counselors and administrators meet often to discuss individual students and how they can give assistance to improve student learning. Departments work collaboratively and make adjustments where needed so that students are better served.

Lehi High also offers over 60 clubs, athletic programs, extracurricular groups that students can participate in. They offer incredible opportunities for involvement and service. We our impressed with what they do, and the impact they have on our student body, school, and community.

With a large student body, it is rewarding to see our students' capability to adapt to the changes and still be Lehi strong. Every public school in Utah has a School Community Council. These councils are comprised of parents (who are elected by parents of students attending the school), the school principal, and school employees (who are elected by employees). Elections at Lehi High School are held at the beginning of each school year. There are always a minimum of two more parents on the SCC than school employees. Membership terms are two years.

The main purposes of the School Community Council are to develop, approve, and assist in implementing the School Improvement Plan, and to allocate LAND Trust funds based on this plan. The council reviews and prepares these plans each year. All plans are reviewed for final approval by our district school board. The SCC also acts as an advisory committee to the administration.

The School Community Council at Lehi High meets on the first Wednesday of each month. LAND Trust 2014-15 Accountability

2014-2015 School LAND Trust Report Amount Allocated: \$164,177

The use of school LAND Trust money is determined by the Lehi High School Community Council and is based on the school improvement plan.

The 2014-15 School Improvement Plan focused on raising the achievement level of students below proficiency. The four areas of focus for the School Improvement Plan were to decrease the failure rate in Secondary Math II by 10%, increase the reading ability of the school, support teacher professional development, and maintain a high graduation rate.

Lehi High has used LAND Trust funds to support academic needs in the following ways:

- Funded two student advocates to monitor student progress in class and in graduation credit.
- Funded one full-time math aide to assist in four support classes for Secondary II Math.
- Funded two part-time aide for guided studies program which allows students to recover lost credit during the school year.
- Funded a reading class to assist those reading below grade level.
- Funded professional development for teachers.
- Funded computer replacement of Social Studies computer lab.

Even without the state measurement, teachers at Lehi High continue to work to improve academic performance along with raising achievement in all subjects.

With the new testing system, scores will be compared, disseminated, and used to guide decisions with LAND Trust money. With our continued efforts as a School Community Council, LHS has increased graduation rates, develop teacher learning, and improve student academic performance and student achievement.

ACT EXAM INFORMATION

ACT PREP OPPORTUNITIES

ACT test prep courses are available for English, math and science. Each week, over a three week cycle, a different course will be taught to help prepare students for the upcoming ACT test. 
SCHOOL GRADE

- College & Career Readiness



One of the goals from our School Improvement Plan is to increase the percentage of students who graduate. To reach the goal of continuous improvement in the number of graduates, our staff has worked hard to remediate earlier, improve instructional teaching, increase student retention rate, and improve communication between parents and students.

With our continued efforts, we have continued to decrease the number of students with Fs from the previous year, which has translated into more students demonstrating mastery in their classes and, more students on track for graduation. We as a faculty and staff are committed to continue our efforts and improve in preparing our students to be career and college ready.

With the growing consensus about the importance of all students mastering a broad range of knowledge and skills we strive to provide students with a variety of career pathways to become college and career ready. This focus has led to an increase in AP exams, improvements on ACT scores, and an increase in college credit earned. Currently at Lehi High School, we offer 16 Advanced Placement courses, 20 Concurrent Enrollment courses, and 16 Distance Education courses through Utah Valley University (UVU). In addition, here at LHS we offer, over 60 Career Technical Education sections and a work-based learning program that provides on-the-job training. As a result, 134 students took MATC courses, 410 students took Concurrent Enrollment and Distant Education courses, and 373 students took Advanced Placement courses. Last year, Lehi High students earned a total of 3,254 college credits.
