## 1. Grade Distribution Conversation and a discussion on Intervention Time

Decrease in failing grades

We changed intervention time, is that working? Is that a contributing factor to this success? Should we do it again next year?

Teresa: loves new intervention. It is helping her identify students. All students who have F's are kids who aren't in class, not because of lack of intervention.

Jessica: Parents are excusing too many absences. They are allowed 20 periods of excused absence. Students with extremely tardy (55 minutes), but are marked tardy not absent. If students attend 15 minutes of class, it counts as attending.

Term 1: Truancy 30% Only 15% have more than 2 days of truancy.

Term 2: 43% Now 34% of student have more than 2 days of truancy.

This is a huge improvement over last year. 30% of the school last year had 60 or more truancies. This year only 15 students or 1.1% of students have that many truancies.

Biggest problems are 1<sup>st</sup> and 4<sup>th</sup> period. Council members wondered if there are specific teachers who have high truancies. Data specialist, Jessica will prepare that.

## 2. Presentation by US History PLC and Government and Civ PLCS
