


Advanced Placement Tests





Adequate Yearly Progress (AYP)

The Westlake High Community serves the students of Eagle Mountain, Saratoga Springs, Cedar Fort and Fairfield. The Eagle Mountain/Saratoga Springs area combined has an estimated population of 50,000 residents and is continually increasing each year. There is one middle school (grades 7 & 8) and ten elementary schools that feed Westlake High.

Westlake High School

Westlake High School was established in 2009. Since its opening, it has been accredited through Northwest Association of Schools and Colleges. The school operates on a quarter system with 180 days of classroom instruction per year. There are 89 certified faculty members, 6 counselors, three assistant principals and one principal.

WHS School/Community Council

Westlake's School/Community Council consists of parents, faculty and administrators.
